But the Cubs -- the Cubs -- had the NL's best record.</p> <p>The Tampa Bay Rays dropped "Devil" from their nickname and won the AL pennant after finishing last every other year.</p> <p>Meanwhile, the Yankees were missing from the post-season. The White Sox got in by winning a playoff game vs. Minnesota.</p> <p>One of the smallest players in baseball, Boston 2B Dustin Pedroia, was the MVP in the AL.</p> <p>In his second season, Tim Lincecum won the NL Cy Young award by going 16-5, 2.62 for substandard San Francisco and leading the NL with 265 strikeouts.</p> <p>In the AL, Cliff Lee won the Cy Young by being nearly unbeatable (22-3) for .500 Cleveland.</p> <p>Manny Ramirez and C.C. Sabathia were traded and immediately returned the Dodgers and Brewers to the post-season after long droughts.</p> | <p>The addition of 1952 fills the last gap in our coverage of the 1946-1971 seasons.</p> <p>The Yankees won a record fourth straight World Series (en route to five straight in 1953) in Mickey Mantle's first full season, replacing the retired Joe DiMaggio in center field.</p> <p>In the AL, the Yankees were only two games better than Cleveland, with its three 20-game winners (Early Wynn, Mike Garcia, Bob Lemon) and its two 100-RBI men (Al Rosen, Larry Doby).</p> <p>In the World Series, the Yankees needed seven games to beat Brooklyn, which had topped the Giants in the NL by 4 1/2 games.</p> <p>Pitcher Allie Reynolds starred for the Yanks, going 20-8, 2.07, posting baseball's lowest ERA, winning the game that clinched at least a tie for the pennant and winning World Series Game 7.</p> <p>In the NL, Robin Roberts was 28-7 for the Phillies and Pittsburgh's Ralph Kiner won the last of his seven straight home run titles. Stan Musial hit .336.</p> | <p>The Washington Senators really did win a World Series once -- just once, in 1924. And with the whole baseball world pulling for him, Walter Johnson finally won a Series game in one of the most dramatic Game 7s ever.</p> <p>The Senators overcame the New York Giants, the first team to win four consecutive pennants.</p> <p>First, Washington had to prevent the New York Yankees from winning their fourth straight pennant in a year when Babe Ruth (.378-46-121) captured his only batting title.</p> <p>But the top hitting exploit was the record .424 batting average by Cardinals second baseman Rogers Hornsby.</p> <p>Then there was Johnson (23-7, 2.72, 158 strikeouts), who was one of <i>two</i> pitchers to win unofficial Triple Crowns of pitching. The other was Dazzy Vance (28-6, 2.16, 262 strikeouts), who led Brooklyn to a surprise second-place finish in an exciting NL race where third-place Pittsburgh finished only 3 games behind the Giants.</p> |
